Church Compound in Hakha Attacked by Tatmadaw

Washington, DC --- At approximately 4:20 pm local time on Monday, August 14, 2023, the Burmese military, or Tatmadaw, launched an attack on the historic Hakha Baptist Church compound in the town of Hakha, Chin State.

A CAM source on the ground reports that soldiers from the Burmese military's Light Infantry Battalion (LIB) 266 fired a rocket-propelled grenade at the compound. The compound contained thirteen residences for clergy; the home of the Senior Pastor was damaged. No injuries were reported. According to the source, the Tatmadaw soldiers falsely claimed that the Chinland Defense Force- Hakha was using the compound as a base.

The Hakha Baptist Church was built by Rev. Arthur Carson, the first American Baptist missionary to the Chin Hills, a century ago.

CAM issues the following statement:

- 1. Condemning the Tatmadaw for this attack on Chin Christian clergy and religious buildings.
- 2. Calling on the administration to determine that these continued atrocities against Christians in Burma constitute war crimes and crimes against humanity.
