# CAM Congressional Briefing Held on Sept. 18, 2023

#### **September 19, 2023**

**Washington, DC** --- On September 18, 2023, CAM held a Congressional Briefing at the Russell Senate Office Building, entitled *Escalating Atrocities Against Christians in Burma*.

CAM Executive Director Zo Tum Hmung spoke about the pattern of persecution against Christians in Burma, including the Chin people, and presented cases of airstrikes against civilians and religious buildings. His remarks are available here.

The event also featured testimony from a Chin pastor originally from Tlanglo Village and a Chin woman whose mother and sister were killed in a military airstrike on Khuafo Village.
